STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

University Preparation Academy

This program focuses on preparing students to enter a bachelor's or master's degree program in highly selective and competitive American universities.

Admission requirements

- High school or university transcripts for the four most recent semesters must show grades in the top 5-10%. Transcripts must be in English.
- New students must have a language proficiency score 90 iBT or 7.5 IELTS
- Continuing students coming directly from UC San Diego's ELI 10-week programs must have excellent attendance and grades in previous ELI classes, placement in one of ELI's highest proficiency levels, and certain minimum scores on ELI's placement exams. (Specific requirements for continuing students are available from the ELI Academic Advisor.)

Program Description

- 25 hours per week
- Can be taken for one or two quarters
- Highly selective admission requirements
- Rigorous class content and heavy homework load
- Focus on writing and speaking skills development for university success
- Focus on success in meeting faculty and peer expectations in the American university classroom
- Students must achieve final grades of "B" or better in all Academy classes

Essential university preparation classes, including:

- Research Paper Writing
- University Advising
- Paraphrasing and Summarizing Skills
- Critical Analysis and Discussion

Concentrated academic skills for university preparation, including:

For continuing students in the Academy, three or four hours per week of Academy class time may be substituted for one main-campus credit-bearing class, depending upon the student's goals and in consultation with the Academic Advisor.

Courses are offered on a rotation basis depending on the quarter when a student enters the program. ELI reserves the right to make changes to the program and course offerings depending on total enrollments and student needs.

Follow-On Programs:

Students who complete one or two quarters in the ELI Academy have the opportunity to continue their studies at the ELI until they receive University admissions. Students may enroll in the Intensive Academic English program, Intensive Pre-University program, and/or University and Professional Studies program before or following completion of one or two quarters in the Academy.

- **Advanced levels only (ELI core levels 108-110) to be determined by ELI tests given upon arrival to UC San Diego, or student must have a language proficiency score of 90 iBT or 8.0 IELTS**
- 4-6 months of previous legal studies or law-related work experience required for admission into this program
- Special nine-hour core class providing
 - an introduction to or a review of U.S. legal systems
 - trial procedures
 - landmark cases
 - social/cultural trends that affect the law
 - guest lectures by legal scholars and practicing attorneys

TEFL Seminar for Professionals

2 weeks

High-intermediate and advanced participants*

Participants must have at least 3 years of EFL classroom teaching experience. This program includes expert guest speakers and visits to local businesses. Guest speaker dates and company visits vary according to availability.

Medical English

High-intermediate and advanced students*

Participants must have previously taken an anatomy/physiology course. This intensive program focuses on the mastery of specific medical vocabulary and idioms, and improvement in the ability to communicate in English in a hospital or clinical setting. Topics include:

- U.S. healthcare delivery system
- the language of patient interaction
- human anatomy and physiology
- medical history-taking
- trauma and emergency care
- diagnostic and treatment procedures
- development of presentation and medical writing skills

UC San Diego is a major center for medical research and development in healthcare. This program features expert guest speakers as available. Due to visitation restrictions and patient privacy laws, we do not guarantee visits to hospitals and clinics nor observations of actual medical procedures as part of the Medical English program.

Tuition: \$2,500

ADVISORY ABOUT VARIABLE ENROLLMENTS

Enrollment numbers in our Academic, Conversation, Conversation and Fluency programs vary greatly from month to month. If our placement tests indicate that a student's English proficiency level does not permit placement in the original 2- or 4-week program class, we may place the student in 2 or 4 weeks of study in a corresponding 4-week or 10-week program, or we may provide a combination of classes and individual tutoring to ensure a full-time program of 20 hours per week for 2 or 4 weeks. Alternatively, we may decide to place all 2- or 4-week program students in level-appropriate classes in a corresponding 4-week or 10-week program in order to provide a program of 20 hours per week for 2 or 4 weeks. When this happens the students' 2- or 4-week program will have the features described for the new 4- or 10-week program, not the features described for the original program. The tuition and fees for the students' 2- or 4-week program enrollment will remain the same.

*Special note about Academic English: Only intermediate, high-intermediate, and advanced students will be accepted into this program. This corresponds to a minimum score of approximately 71 on the iBT or 6.0 on the IELTS or First Cambridge Exam (FCE): Pass. Students who do not obtain minimum scores on UCSD-ELI placement exams will be transferred to the Conversation and Fluency program.

*Special note about Business English and Medical English: Only high-intermediate, and advanced students will be accepted into these programs. This corresponds to a minimum score of approximately 80 on the iBT or 7.0 on the IELTS or Cambridge Advanced: Pass. Students who do not obtain minimum scores on UCSD-ELI placement exams will be transferred to the Academic English program.

Work Experience and University Study

DANILO GASQUES RODRIGUES, BRAZIL

The UC San Diego UPS program brought me closer to the greatest minds in the Computer Science field. Several innovations in this field were developed by UC San Diego's professors or former students. Therefore, studying with these intellectuals not only improved my skills, but also inspired me to apply for Academic Training (for J-1 visa holders, similar to OPT). This summer I'll be part of a research project that uses multidisciplinary concepts from the Computer Sciences, Arts, and Social Sciences in order to apply visualization algorithms to study crowds.



THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, AND THE CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGES

The University of California has 10 campuses, more than 220,000 students, and is designed for the best qualified students. Only the top 12.5% of California high school students are eligible for entry, but a much smaller percentage is accepted.

The California State University has 23 campuses, over 433,000 students, and is much more inclusive than the University of California system. The top 25% of California high school students are eligible for entry. Website: calstate.edu

The California Community Colleges has 109 campuses, over 2.8 million students, and provides the first two years of college education only. Students spend their first two years at a community college and then transfer to one of the campuses of the University of California or California State University, to complete their last two years of undergraduate study. Website: ccco.edu

UC San Diego Extension provides advice and pathways to help students achieve work experience and enroll in a degree program at a university or professional school in the United States.

WORK EXPERIENCE: OPTIONAL PRACTICAL TRAINING (OPT)

After one academic year (three consecutive quarters) of full-time study in a non-language program in the United States, students can apply for permission to work up to 12 months in their field of study as a practical application of what they have learned. This is called Optional Practical Training (OPT).

The International Student Services (ISS) staff will assist students with their application for OPT. The ISS staff has a very high success rate with OPT applications. They cannot, however, guarantee the approval of the application by the U.S. government.

Please note that the International Student Services staff does not assist with job search or job placement services.

VIERA ONDERISINOVA, BUSINESS MANAGEMENT, SLOVAKIA

The Business Management Certificate I received from UC San Diego Extension qualified me to pursue a career in banking. My internship at the local bank turned into a full-time position through OPT. I started work as a Loan Operations Specialist, and after six months I was transferred to the position of Personal Banker. Five months later I was offered a job as a Credit Analyst.



APPLYING FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION TO UC SAN DIEGO

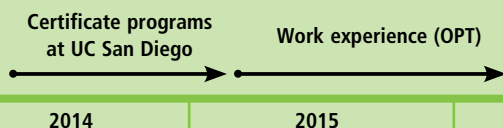
It is difficult to enter UC San Diego as a foreign student in the first year. It is much easier to transfer from a California community college (after two years of study) into the third year at UC San Diego. In recent years over 90% of transfer students come from California community colleges. This is the best pathway to undergraduate UC San Diego admission for most international students.

UC SAN DIEGO'S SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM: ACADEMIC CONNECTIONS INTERNATIONAL (ACI)

Academic Connections International (ACI) is a summer 3-week UC San Diego academic and residential immersion program targeted to international secondary students who are 16–18 years of age and have advanced English proficiency.

Students enroll in one course to explore a particular topic in depth. In addition to a challenging and active learning experience, social and recreational activities are planned for the afternoons and on weekends.

Who should take this program?

This program is for students with strong academic records and advanced English proficiency who would like to have an insightful American pre-university preparation experience along with American teenage students.

Program Features:

- On-campus housing with American students for three weeks
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner at campus cafeteria
- UC San Diego academic instruction and activities
- An opportunity to take various chaperoned field trips to local sites
- Access to laboratory equipment as part of classwork
- Guest speakers
- Project supplies
- Transportation to and from scheduled field trips during the program
- Constant adult supervision

University and Professional Studies Program

If you have very advanced English language skills, high university grades, and are prepared to work hard, you can take UC San Diego university courses and/or UC San Diego Extension university courses for a unique study abroad experience in one of the most prestigious universities in the world.

UNIVERSITY AND PROFESSIONAL STUDIES (UPS)

The UPS program is an opportunity for international students with strong academic backgrounds who would like to take a full-time schedule of credit-bearing courses at UC San Diego or UC San Diego Extension while studying alongside American university students.

Universities in many countries count these credits towards their own bachelor's or master's degree programs. Transferability is at the discretion of the home university and must be verified in advance by the student.

In the fall, winter, and spring quarters, UPS students take a full-time program (12-units) consisting of UC San Diego and/or UC San Diego Extension courses in any combination. The following are some of the departments and courses that UPS students have enrolled in:

The cool thing about the UPS program is that you can pick and choose classes from both UC San Diego Extension and UC San Diego main campus classes. I loved how I had full freedom to pick the classes that I wanted to fill up my 12 units.



Note about graduate-level courses: Students in this program may not enroll in graduate business courses at the Rady School of Management or any courses in the School of Medicine or the School of Pharmacy. Most graduate-level courses at SIO are not open to visiting students. Availability of graduate-level courses in other departments is limited and strictly controlled for prerequisites.

ENROLLMENT IS ON A SPACE-AVAILABLE BASIS

Enrollment in all classes is on a **space-available** basis and requires instructor and/or departmental approval after the student arrives.

If there are no available spaces, the instructor may require that the student wait for several days to see if any other students drop the class before enrolling a UPS student. Many class enrollments are not confirmed and completed until the second or third week of the quarter.

It is especially difficult to get enrollment approvals for first-choice classes in our prestigious Economics department.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT CHOOSING CLASSES

It is very important to be flexible in your course selection and include a list of 12 or more classes per quarter that you would like to take when applying for admission to the UPS program.

The popular **Business Essentials** and **Business Management** certificate programs offer students a competitive advantage to build job skills and knowledge or to pursue graduate studies through an extensive introduction to U.S. business practices. To complement the classroom experience, **internships** are incorporated into both of these business programs, allowing each student the opportunity to apply what is learned in an American workplace and gain a competitive edge in the global job market. Additionally, given the increased demand for project managers and web developers, we offer certificate programs in **Project Management and Web Publishing**.

Business Essentials is designed for international students who are 21 years old and above, with at least two years of university study and minimal work experience, who wish to obtain a broad introduction to American business practices.

The first quarter also allows students to participate in an on-campus internship experience. (First-quarter textbook included.)

Business Essentials (2 quarters) \$10,500

Second-quarter courses build upon the foundation developed in the first quarter of Business Essentials.

The curriculum consists of the following required courses:

- Introduction to Business
- Basics of Project Management
- Business Communication Skills
- Organizational Behavior
- Marketing: Experiential Learning

Business Essentials (3 quarters) \$14,500

Third-quarter courses continue to enrich students' knowledge.

The curriculum consists of the following required courses:

- Bookkeeping for Business
- The Recruiting Process
- SEO and Marketing

In addition to the required courses, students will have the opportunity to choose additional units from a list of business elective courses as offered by the business department.

- 4) Essay: minimum 200 words explaining your qualifications and motivation for taking the program.
- 5) Must be 21 years old by the program start-date.

Q & A - ALL BUSINESS CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

1. Can I apply without all the required documents?

No. You will need to wait to apply until you have **all** the required documents. The **only exception** is if you have all the required documents except the language score AND you are currently attending the UC San Diego Extension English Language Institute. Only students who attend UCSD-ELI can apply for conditional admissions to our business certificate programs.

2. What is conditional acceptance?

It means you are provisionally accepted based on all requirements except for the language score. This is strictly for students currently attending UC San Diego Extension English Language Institute. An acceptable language score is still required before you will be fully accepted.

3. Is there a deadline to apply?

Given the popularity of the programs, it is recommended to submit the application **FIVE months in advance** for the Business Essentials program and **THREE months in advance** for the other business programs. Admission is competitive, and not all applicants are admitted to the program. **NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHIN THE FINAL WEEK BEFORE A PROGRAM'S START-DATE.**

4. Is a car required?

Yes, access to a car or other reliable transportation is required, as some classes (day and/or evening) are located at the off-campus UC San Diego Extension facility (University City Center), which has very limited or no public transportation.

5. Can I add an extra quarter after I arrive?

Yes; however, if the student requests and is approved for a longer program, the student must pay a \$500 USD Business Program Extension fee, plus any additional tuition required for the longer program. However, if the student requests and is approved for a longer program during the first week of classes in their first quarter, the Business Department will waive the \$500 Program Extension fee.

Business Certificate Programs

Project Management (2 quarters) \$12,000

Who should take this program?

The Project Management Program is designed for the student who has obtained a bachelor's degree and one to two years of full-time, post-university, professional work experience AND who is seeking a practical, hands-on approach to gaining the knowledge and tools necessary for handling complex projects within various types of organizations and industries. Based on the Project Management Body of Knowledge (PMBOK) developed by the Project Management Institute (PMI), the curriculum provides an in-depth study of the elements essential to initiate, execute and complete a successful project.

Program Benefits:

- Develop highly marketable competencies in project management.
- Build strong interpersonal skills critical to conducting work in a team environment; enhance abilities to manage conflicts and address challenging situations.
- Complete a final capstone class, where you will have the opportunity to use the tools acquired in the program to complete a directed-studies project.
- Study alongside American students in some of the classes, building your professional network.
- Fulfill the necessary education hours needed for the PMI Certification exam.
- Take this alone or in sequence with another business program; apply for OPT after three consecutive quarters of study.

Note: This full-time program is offered in Spring Quarter and Fall Quarter only.

Web Publishing (1 quarter) \$6,500

Who should take this program?

Web Publishing is designed for programmers, graphic artists, multimedia developers, and marketing professionals who have a bachelor's degree and one to two years of full-time, post-university, professional work experience. The program provides individuals with the skills necessary to design, build, and implement successful web sites. This specialized certificate program covers a concentrated study of HTML web publishing for the development of Web applications. Take this alone or in sequence with other business programs.

Who should take this program

This three-month course is a foundation course in TEFL.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE PROGRAM IN TEFL

Who should take this program

This six-month program focuses on the development of effective classroom teaching skills and modern English language teaching techniques to students in non-English speaking countries and to non-immigrants in U.S. classrooms.

Both prospective and current English teachers can substantially improve their knowledge of English language teaching in this program.

What this program includes

The curriculum consists of the following eight required core courses:

- Theories and Methods of Language Teaching and Learning (27 hours)
- Theory and Methods of Reading Instruction (27 hours)
- Teaching Writing for Academic and Professional Purposes (27 hours)
- Best Methods in Teaching Pronunciation and Fluency (27 hours)

- Advanced Analysis of English Sentence Structure-I (27 hours)
- Best Methods in Teaching Listening Skills (27 hours)
- TEFL Practicum: Best Methods in Developing & Delivering Lesson Plans (27 hours)

CONCURRENT TEFL STUDIES

The Teaching English to the Young Learner (TEYL) certificate and the certificate in Teaching English Grammar (TEG) are concurrent 12-unit certificate programs which can be fulfilled by taking 3 required courses (3 units each) and an additional 3 units of electives. The required courses and electives for each certificate program are not all offered in one quarter. It may take up to three quarters to complete each certificate. Students can complete either the TEYL or TEG while enrolled in the Six-Month Professional TEFL Certificate and the Special Studies in TEFL program.

TEACHING ENGLISH GRAMMAR (TEG)

Who should take this program

Students who are already enrolled in the Professional TEFL Certificate and/or the Special Studies certificate, and who are interested in attaining additional competencies in teaching English as a foreign language.

What this program includes

The required core courses are:

- Advanced Analysis of English Sentence Structure-I (3 units)
- Advanced Analysis of English Sentence Structure-II (3 units)

Students can choose 6 units from the following courses:

- Grammar Workshops I-IV (four different 1-unit workshops)
- Grammar and Editing I & II (3 units each)
- Advanced Grammar Seminar (3 units)

TEG certificate fee: \$100 (non-refundable)

General Information

Minimum Age Requirement

You must be at least 21 years old to apply to our business certificate programs, and 18 years old to enroll in other programs. Seventeen-year-old students may be admitted when accompanied by an adult guardian and the parents submit a letter attesting to the student's maturity. For more information please contact ipadmission@ucsd.edu. **This age requirement does not apply to the Academic Connections International youth program.**

When to Apply

It is recommended to submit the application FIVE months in advance for the Business Essentials program and THREE months in advance for the other business programs. For all business certificate programs, no applications will be accepted within the final week prior to the published program start-date. Please see pages 2-3 for specific application deadlines for our TEFL and UPS programs. There are no application deadlines for our other programs. These programs close when they are full, regardless of application deadlines. In any case, it is best to apply 12–16 weeks before the program start-date to allow enough time for us to process your application and for you to make your visa and travel arrangements.

NOTE: If a proof of English proficiency or any other required application document is submitted later than the TEFL deadline, a **\$100 late-submission fee** will be required if we are able to accommodate a late application review and if there is space in the program.

Certificates

Certificates with the UC San Diego university seal are awarded upon successful completion of your program. Excellent attendance is an important part of certificate eligibility in all programs.

Payment

Total fees and tuition must be received in our office 30 days prior to the published program start-date. Accepted methods of payment: Cash, credit card (VISA/MasterCard/AMEX/Diners Club/Discover), traveler's checks, personal check, money order, cashier's check (drawn in U.S. currency on a U.S. bank), or bank wire. **We cannot accept payment by bank wire for the application fee or express mail fee. Please pay these fees by credit card or check (U.S. bank only).**

It takes 10 – 15 business days for money sent by bank wire to be posted to a student's account, and payments made by credit card are sometimes delayed because of credit card limits. Due to these delays, **we strongly recommend that students or their agents complete payment of all tuition and fees at least 45 days before their program start-date** to ensure timely receipt and recording of payment and to avoid delays in the beginning of the student's program.

Fees for Late-Arrival and Late-Registration

If a student arrives on time and is not able to complete registration by the end of the first day of the program or if a new student arrives late, we will charge the student a \$200 USD Late Registration Fee. Students should be sure to arrange their travel to San Diego and accommodations in advance so that they can be here for the first day of the program. The first day of the program is the published start-date in our brochure and on our website.

Note: If sending a bank wire, please remember to immediately send all bank wire information to ipfinancials@ucsd.edu so that we can identify payment at the campus bank wire office and credit the student's account before the program begins. **There is a required non-refundable fee of \$25 for each bank wire payment.**

If a student pays all fees to an agency, the student must bring an agency voucher to the program registration to verify that all payments to an agency have been made.

Withdrawals and Non-Refundable Fees

All application, testing, insurance, International Student Service, express mail, bank wire, program change, late registration and cancellation fees are non-refundable. Non-refundable fees cannot be transferred between programs. **Application fees are not transferable to different dates or programs.**

Students who applied through an agency or representative are subject to the agency refund policy and will receive any refund through their agency, not from UC San Diego.

All refund requests must be in writing. All charges are subject to change. Please inquire about current charges at time of withdrawal or change of program. Refunds take approximately 5-6 weeks to process.

Note: We recommend payment of tuition and fees by credit card. If a student cancels or withdraws from a program, a refund to a credit card takes just 7-10 business days. A refund to a student by any other means can take 4-6 weeks to process, plus 4-10 weeks for overseas mail delivery.

Visas

UC San Diego Extension International Programs is authorized under federal law to enroll non-immigrant alien students. We issue the I-20 form to students who meet our admission requirements and who provide evidence of sufficient financial verification. Almost all students in our full-time programs come to the United States on F-1 student visas. In order to get an F-1 student visa, you will need an I-20 Form (Certificate of Eligibility for F-1 Visa). You then take this I-20 to a U.S. Embassy or Consulate and apply for an F-1 Visa.

If you plan to apply for an F-1 visa, please complete the I-20 Request section on page A4 of the application for enrollment in this brochure and provide signatures and a statement of financial verification as indicated. You can also find our application form on our website: www.ip.extension.ucsd.edu and click on the tab called "How to Enroll."

If you are in any doubt about which kind of visa you need, we recommend that you ask either your local counseling source or the U.S. Embassy or Consulate for information. You may also contact our office at ipinfo@ucsd.edu.

Additional Costs

ISS Program Change Fee \$150

This fee is required each time the applicant wants to change programs or program dates after submitting the original application for enrollment.

Late Registration Fee \$200

This fee is required if a student is not able to complete registration by the end of the first day of the published program start-date.

Business Program Extension Fee \$500

If the student requests and is approved for a longer program, the student must pay a \$500 USD Business Program Extension fee, plus any additional tuition required for the longer program. However, if the student requests and is approved for a longer program during the first week of classes in their first quarter, the Business Department will waive the \$500 Program Extension fee.

International Student Services Fee (required)

Students have access to many University Extension resources, including computer labs, academic advising, visa counseling, housing assistance, campus Student Health Services, and many other general student needs.

- Cost:
- \$140 per short program or seminar of 1- 4 weeks
 - \$350 per quarter or session of 5- 10 weeks
 - \$700 for 2-quarter programs
 - \$1,050 for 3-quarter programs

Airport Transportation

The San Diego airport is located in downtown San Diego, about 30 minutes from the UC San Diego campus by car and about 1 hour 20 minutes by bus.

There are options according to housing choice:

Homestay or rent a room in a home - For an additional fee your host family will pick you up and bring you to the San Diego airport when you return to your country at the end of your UC San Diego studies. Inquire when booking for details.

Off-campus apartments by Anatolia and PC Housing - Airport pickup service may be included for stays of 10 weeks or more. Inquire when booking for cost.

Off-campus housing by the Marriott Residence Inn - Information about a discount shuttle will be provided after reservation confirmation. Inquire when booking for details.

On-campus housing (summer only) - Information on airport shuttle and taxi transportation is included with UC San Diego Extension International Programs' acceptance materials.

Books and Instructional Materials

Payment for all books and instructional materials CANNOT be made in advance and are to be purchased upon arrival at UC San Diego.

ELI 10-week Programs: approximately \$250 per program

ELI Short-term Programs: approximately \$150-\$175 per program (varies by program)

Certificate and University Credit Programs: Approximately \$200-800 per quarter.

Computer Labs and Internet Access

All international students have access to two computer labs (46 stations) at UC San Diego Extension. Preference for computer lab use is given to class-related work.

All computers have high-speed internet connections and are functional in multiple languages. Printing costs 10 cents per page; no cost for computer use.

Meals

The cost of meals varies greatly depending on budget and tastes, but a good meal costs about \$8 - \$10.

Note that some housing choices include some meals. Homestay, for example, includes breakfast and dinner, and on-campus housing in summer includes three meals per day.

Medical Insurance (required)

Medical Insurance is mandatory for all students. The insurance must be in ENGLISH and INCLUDE DATES OF COVERAGE (start date and end date) FOR THE ENTIRE PERIOD OF YOUR PROGRAM. Insurance paid in monthly installments will not be accepted. The Medical Insurance Verification Form on page A5 of the application form must be filled out by the student's insurance company and sent to iphealth@ucsd.edu at least 30 days before the start of the program. If you do not have adequate proof of insurance for the amounts shown on our Medical Insurance Verification Form, then you must purchase UC San Diego medical Insurance. The UC San Diego Extension medical insurance policy for international students covers hospitalization, with some exceptions, and many other medical expenses, but not dental or eye care. You can purchase dental and vision plans at an additional cost. Please contact iphealth@ucsd.edu for details. Medical insurance is non-refundable. (Any accompanying spouse or children must also have medical insurance for the duration of the student's enrollment at UC San Diego).

Library Card (optional)

You can use the campus Library without charge. To borrow books, however, you must buy a library card: approximately \$15 for three months.

UC San Diego Photo Identification Card (optional)

This includes a San Diego Transit bus sticker which gives you free use of some bus routes near campus. Payment for the UC San Diego photo ID card CANNOT be made in advance and can only be purchased after the arrival at UC San Diego. Cost: \$15

Recreation Card (optional)

To use the campus swimming pools, tennis courts, fitness centers, and other campus recreational facilities, you have to buy a "Rec Card," which is approximately \$100 per quarter.

Transportation (optional)

Bike rental: approximately \$45 per week, or \$130 per quarter.

Bus pass: \$50 for a calendar-month student pass. Unlimited use.

Car rental: approximately \$500 per month.

Parking on campus: approximately \$61 per month. See parking.ucsd.edu.

OPT Application Assistance (optional)

We provide advising and application assistance to students who apply to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services for permission to work in the U.S. for up to one year under the Optional Practical Training program (See page 12.) Cost: \$100 (Government filing fees are a separate cost.)

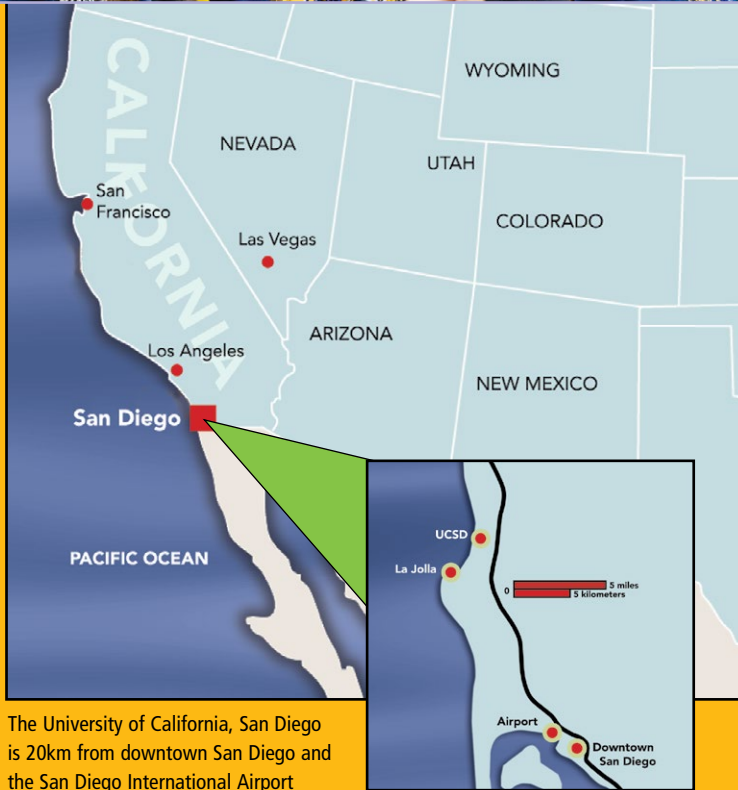
