

#### Environment

The University of Alabama has one of the largest and most beautiful campuses in the United States, with lots of trees, flowers, grass and open spaces.

#### Events

Students may participate in a wide variety of academic, cultural, recreational and social events on campus, including lectures, concerts, plays and sporting events.

#### Facilities

ELI students have access to all student facilities at UA, including libraries, computer labs, the Student Health Center, outdoor recreational facilities and the very popular Student Recreation Center.

In addition to campus-wide activities, you can participate in special cultural and recreational activities which the ELI plans for its students, including weekend trips to nearby cities and attractions as well as local activities.

#### Transportation

#### From and to the airport

The ELI arranges transportation for its students from the airport in Birmingham, Alabama (BHM) to the UA campus in Tuscaloosa on the two days before the start of each session. Return transportation from Tuscaloosa to the Birmingham airport is scheduled on the day after each session ends. ELI-sponsored airport transportation is less expensive than other public means of airport transportation.

#### In the city

UA typically arranges free transportation for weekly shopping trips from the campus to popular local shopping areas. Public transportation (buses, taxis) is also available.

#### On campus

Free, continuous bus service makes it easy and convenient for students to get around the UA campus.



- 6 levels of study (beginning to advanced)

  New students take the ELI Placement Exam on the first day of the session and are placed in the appropriate level for each core class (Reading/Writing, Speaking/Listening, Structure).
- 20 to 24 hours of class per week
  Full-time students study 20 hours per week in core/elective classes and up
  to 4 additional hours per week in Culturally Speaking (optional) and Friday
  Afternoon Seminars (optional). Classes typically meet between 8:00 am and
  4:30 pm each Monday Thursday and from 8:00 am to noon each Friday.
- Professional, experienced teachers

  All ELI faculty members have master's degrees in TESL (Teaching English as a Second Language). Many have also lived and taught outside of the United States.

- 6 sessions per year, each lasting 6 to 8 weeks
   Each fall and spring session lasts 8 weeks, and each summer session lasts
   6 weeks. Students may enroll for one session or for multiple sessions.
- Half sessions available
   Half sessions last 4 weeks (fall and spring) or 3 weeks (summer) and begin on the same dates as full sessions.

#### Calendar of IEP Sessions

Fall and spring sessions are 8 weeks long, and summer sessions are 6 weeks long. All sessions include at least 156 hours of classroom instruction. Half sessions are available at the beginning of each full session (4 weeks in fall and spring, 3 weeks in summer). Cost of IEP Sessions (valid through Summer 2, 2013) Some costs are lower in the summer because summer sessions last 6 weeks, while fall and spring sessions last 8 weeks. Costs typically increase slightly each academic year beginning in August with the Fall 1 session. All costs are listed in US dollars.







Conditional Admission to the University of Alabama

No TOEFL? No problem!

If you are an excellent student and wish to apply for admission to an academic degree program at The University of Alabama (UA), but you do not have good enough English skills or a good TOEFL/IELTS score yet, don't worry—you can apply for "conditional admission!" UA offers *Conditional Admission* for undergraduate study (bachelor's degree) and *Provisional Language Admission* for graduate study (master's or doctoral degree) to international students who meet the academic qualifications for admission but who do not yet have sufficient proficiency in English.








If you receive Conditional Admission or Provisional Language Admission at UA, you will first study intensive English at the UA English Language Institute (ELI). After your English improves and you have met the language requirement, you will begin taking undergraduate or graduate classes for credit when the next UA semester begins.

#### How to Apply

- 1. Decide when you would like to begin your study at the ELI. Choose from one of the ELI's 6 sessions annually see on the IEP: Calendar, Cost, Admission tab.
- 2. Complete and submit the online application on the ELI website (www.eli.ua.edu). You must pay the required \$50 application fee when you submit your application.
- 3. Send the financial support document to the ELI office.

  The ELI must receive your financial support document before you can be admitted. See "How to Apply" on the ELI website for more details about this required document.

#### After You Apply

- 1. When your application is received in the ELI office, you will receive an email with instructions on how to pay the required tuition deposit (\$100) and the optional express mail fee (\$50).
- 2. When all required fees have been paid and your financial document has been approved by the ELI, your application will be processed for admission.
- 3. After you are approved for admission, you will receive (a) an email confirming your admission and (b) a package in the mail containing your letter of admission, an I-20 document for your student visa, and further instructions regarding your admission, enrollment and travel to the United States. If you paid for the express mail service, you will also receive an email with the tracking number for the package.
- 4. After you receive your documents, please review them carefully, follow the instructions, and contact the ELI office if you have questions or concerns.
